

Applicants are selected by an Assessment Committee, which may, at its discretion, require applicants to undertake an interview to facilitate the decision-making process. To ensure full advantage is taken of the training provided, selection will take place principally on the basis of academic criteria and the applicants' personal motivation and interest in the subject matter. The date of the applications will also be taken into account.

If a high number of applications are received, the Assessment Committee may decide to set a written entrance examination. An appropriate example examination paper will be uploaded to the University website in good time in such a case.

The admission requirements and criteria will be published on the University website for applicants to view, together with the rest of the information regarding the programme. Information will also be made available in marketing leaflets, on noticeboards and, in particular, at the relevant Secretary's Office at the University. The admission criteria will be applied as follows:
